Notice of Annual General Meeting

The Company's Annual General Meeting (the "AGM" or "Meeting") will be held on 30 June 2022 at 11:00 am BST at the offices of W H Ireland at 24 Martin Lane, London, EC4R0DR. The formal notice convening the AGM (the "Notice of AGM" or "Notice") on pages 6 and 8 of this document sets out the business to be considered at the Meeting. The purpose of this letter is to explain certain elements of that business to you.

Business of the Meeting

An explanation of each of the resolutions to be proposed at the AGM is set out below. Resolutions 1 to 11 will be proposed as ordinary resolutions; this means that for each of those ordinary resolutions to be passed, more than half of the votes cast must be in favour of the resolution. Resolutions 12 to 14 will be proposed as special resolutions; this means that for each of those resolutions to be passed, at least three-quarters of the votes cast must be in favour of the resolution.

Ordinary Resolutions

Resolution 1 – To receive the Annual Report and Accounts

The Directors are required to present the Strategic Report, Directors' Report and Auditor's Report and annual accounts of the Company to the Meeting. These are contained in the Company's Annual Report and Financial Statements for the period ending 31 December 2021.

Resolution 2 – To appoint PKF Littlejohn as auditor of the Company

At each meeting at which the Company's annual accounts are laid before its Members, the Company is required to appoint an auditor to serve until the next such meeting. This resolution proposes the appointment of PKF Littlejohn as auditor of the Company, to hold office until the conclusion of the next general meeting of the Company at which annual accounts are laid before its members.

Resolution 3 – To authorise the Audit Committee to determine the remuneration of the auditor

This resolution gives authority to the Audit Committee to determine the auditor's remuneration.

Resolutions 4 – 9 – Re-election of Directors

All Directors will retire at the AGM and seek re-election.

Resolution 10 – To authorise the Directors to allot Ordinary Shares

The purpose of this resolution is to give the Directors powers to allot shares. The authority in paragraph (a) of this resolution, if passed, would provide the Directors with a general authority to allot new shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert other securities into, shares up to a nominal amount of £37,547.54, which is equal to approximately one-third of the issued share capital of the Company.

Paragraph (b) of this resolution will grant the Directors additional authority to allot new shares and grant rights to subscribe for, or convert other securities into, shares up to a further nominal amount of £37,547.54

pursuant to a rights issue, which is equal to approximately one-third of the issued share capital of the Company.

The Directors have no present intention of exercising the authorities sought pursuant to this resolution but consider them desirable to allow the Company to retain flexibility. The authorities will expire on 30 June 2023, or, if earlier, at the conclusion of the next annual general meeting to be held in 2023, unless previously renewed, revoked or varied by the Company in a general meeting. It is the intention of the Directors to renew these authorities annually at each annual general meeting.

Resolution 11 – To remove certain limits on the award of share options to employees under the i3 Energy plc Employee Share Option Plan

The Company adopted the i3 Energy plc Employee Share Option Plan (the “Plan”) on 18 July 2017.

Under the terms of the Plan, the market value of all shares subject to options that are awarded to any employee in respect of any particular financial year of the Company cannot exceed: (i) 100% of that employee’s base salary; or (ii) if the Directors determine that exceptional circumstances exist, 300% of that employee’s base salary.

The Directors do not consider that the general limit on awards to employees in any particular financial year not exceeding 100% serves any useful purpose. It is therefore proposed that this be amended such that the market value of all shares subject to options that are awarded to any employee in respect of a particular financial year of the Company are limited at 300% of their base salary.

Special Resolutions

Resolution 12 – To authorise the Directors to disapply pre-emption rights

Section 561(1) of the Companies Act 2006 provides that if the Directors wish to allot any equity securities or sell any treasury shares (if it holds any), for cash, the Company must first offer them to existing shareholders in proportion to their existing shareholdings. Section 561 does not apply in connection with allotments made pursuant to an employee share scheme.

The purpose of this resolution is to seek power for the Directors to allot equity securities or sell any treasury shares for cash as if Section 561(1) of the Companies Act 2006 did not apply, in connection with rights issues, open offers and other pre-emptive and non-pre-emptive offers and issues pursuant to the authority granted by resolution 10. The power conferred by this resolution will expire on 30 June 2023, or, if earlier, at the conclusion of the next annual general meeting to be held in 2023, unless previously renewed, revoked or varied by the Company in a general meeting. It is the intention of the Directors to renew this power annually at each annual general meeting.

The Board considers that it is in the best interests of Shareholders for the Company to have the authority to place new Ordinary Shares for cash without the application of pre-emption rights, subject to the limitations set out in resolutions 10 and 12. In these uncertain times, the Board considers it prudent to retain sufficient financial flexibility to be able to meet unanticipated challenges and to take advantage of market opportunities which may present themselves. The Board confirms it has no current intention to place new Ordinary Shares for cash without the application of pre-emption rights.

Resolution 13 – To approve the purchase of the Company’s own shares

This resolution would, if passed, authorise the Company to make market purchases of up to 112,642,599 of its own Ordinary Shares, representing approximately 10% of the Company’s issued share capital. The resolution specifies the minimum and maximum prices at which the Ordinary Shares may be bought under this authority. This authority will expire at the conclusion of the Company’s next annual general meeting, or 30 June 2023, whichever is earlier.

The Directors have no present intention to exercise the authority granted by this resolution, but the authority provides the flexibility to allow them to do so in the future. The Directors would not exercise the authority unless they believed that the expected effect would promote the success of the Company for the benefit of its shareholders as a whole. Any shares purchased would be effected by a purchase in the market and may either be cancelled or held as treasury shares, which may then be cancelled or sold for cash. As at the date of this letter, the Company did not hold any shares in treasury.

Resolution 14 – To adopt new Articles of Association

It is proposed to adopt new Articles of Association to update the Company's current Articles of Association. The purpose of this resolution is for the draft Articles of Association in the form produced to the Meeting and initialed by the Chair (for the purpose of identification) to be adopted as the Company's Articles of Association in substitution for, and to the exclusion of, the existing Articles of Association.

The changes introduced in the new Articles are primarily to reflect developments in market practice and legal and regulatory requirements. The principal changes are to allow AGMs and other meetings to be held both in-person and virtually.

It is also proposed that the current Article 87 of the articles (relating to the remuneration of Non-Executive Directors) will be amended to give the Directors discretion on the fees paid to Non-Executive Directors. The increase will provide the Company with the flexibility to appoint additional Non-Executive Directors if appropriate.

Recommendation

Full details of the above resolutions are contained in the Notice. The Directors believe that all of the proposed resolutions to be considered at the AGM are in the best interests of the Company and its Members as a whole. Accordingly, the Directors unanimously recommend that you vote in favour of all the resolutions, as they intend to do in respect of their own beneficial holdings.

Each Ordinary Share carries the right to one vote at a General Meeting of the Company and, therefore, the total number of voting rights in the Company on 2 June 2022 is 1,126,425,992. The website referred to in note 2 will include information on the number of shares and voting rights.

13 Questions at the Meeting

Under Section 319A of the Act, the Company must answer any question you ask relating to the business being dealt with at the Meeting unless:

- a) answering the question would interfere unduly with the preparation for the Meeting or involve the disclosure of confidential information;
- b) the answer has already been given on a website in the form of an answer to a question; or
- c) it is undesirable in the interests of the Company or the good order of the Meeting that the question be answered.

14 Website Publication of Audit Concerns

Under Section 527 of the Companies Act 2006, shareholders meeting the threshold requirements set out in that section have the right to require the Company to publish on a website a statement setting out any matter relating to: (i) the audit of the Company's financial statements (including the Auditor's Report and the conduct of the audit) that are to be laid before the Meeting; or (ii) any circumstances connected with an auditor of the Company ceasing to hold office since the previous meeting at which annual financial statements and reports were laid in accordance with Section 437 of the Companies Act 2006 (in each case) that the shareholders propose to raise at the relevant meeting. The Company may not require the shareholders requesting any such website publication to pay its expenses in complying with Sections 527 or 528 of the Companies Act 2006. Where the Company is required to place a statement on a website under Section 527 of the Companies Act 2006, it must forward the statement to the Company's auditor not later than the time when it makes the statement available on the website. The business which may be dealt with at the Meeting for the relevant financial year includes any statement that the Company has been required under Section 527 of the Companies Act 2006 to publish on a website.

15 Documents on Display
